

The SDC-650 is a fully UVC-compliant camera with built-in microphone that can be used as a high-quality webcam with SMART Board interactive displays, keeping the continuity of a classroom experience even while video conferencing.







Power adapter

Your document camera comes with a power adapter, including a country specific power cord (for EU, UK, and North America) that connects to the external power supply.

USB cable

Use the USB cable to connect your document camera to your computer. You can display objects, capture images to SMART Notebook files, and control your document camera from SMART Notebook software.

If you need to extend the USB connection, see the *Troubleshooting and extending USB 2.0 and USB 3.0* connection knowledge base article for guidance.

Wi-Fi dongle

Use the Wi-Fi dongle to connect your document camera to the network.

Understanding Camera and PC modes

You can use your document camera in Camera or Computer Pass-Through (PC) mode. Each mode enables you to do different things and requires a specific connection to a display, projector, or computer.

Camera mode


In Camera mode, you can view live images captured by the document camera:

- In SMART Notebook software using the USB connection
- In SMART Document Camera software using the USB or WiFl connection
- On a display or projector using the HDMI out connection or Miracast (if the display or projector supports it)

Computer Pass-Through (PC) mode

PC mode enables you to view your computer's desktop on a connected display or projector. In this mode, the document camera acts as a pass-through device between the computer and the display or projector.

To use this mode, connect an HDMI cable to your computer and then to the HDMI IN port on the document camera, then connect a second HDMI cable from the document camera's HDMI OUT port to a display or projector.



NOTES

- The Capture button on the document camera's control panel has no effect in PC mode.
- In PC mode, you can view the document camera live image only in SMART Notebook software.



Setting up your document camera

Before you use the SMART Document Camera, unfold and position it, then connect it to power to fully charge the battery. Before you connect the document camera to a device, install the software on the device. After the software's installed, you can connect the document camera to that device.

To unfold and position your document camera

- 1. Hold the handle of the document camera to stabilize it.
- 2. Lift the camera arm up, then pull the camera arm outward.
- 3. Rotate the camera head and aim the lens at your object.



To connect your document camera to the power supply and charge the battery

1. Connect the provided power supply cable to the DC port on the right connection panel.

NOTE

Before you use the camera for the first time, charge the battery fully. The battery charge indicator on the front panel shows you the battery's status. For more information about the battery charge indicator, see *Battery charge indicator* on page 12.

2. Connect the power supply cable to a power outlet.

After the power is connected, the document camera enters Standby mode and starts charging.

Turning your document camera on and off

After you've completed the basic connections, you are ready to turn the document camera on for the first time.

To turn on your document camera

Press on the control panel or the remote control until the power indicator light turns green.

To turn off your document camera

Press on the control panel or remote control for three seconds.

The power indicator light turns off.

NOTE

If you press and hold the power button for less than three seconds, the document camera enters Standby mode and the power indicator light shines solid red.

Installing software for your document camera

Before you use your document camera, download the required software to get the most out of your document camera. Download and install the latest version of the following software before you connect your document camera to a device:

Connecting to a computer or display

There are a number of ways to connect your SMART Document Camera to a display device, such as a computer or SMART Board interactive display:

Method	Description
USB Out	Use this method if you will be using the document camera with a computer or a SMART Board interactive display with iQ.
	NOTE This method is required if you plan to use the document camera with SMART Notebook software.
HDMI Out	Use this method to connect directly to a display that has an HDMI port, such as a SMART Board interactive display.
Wireless	Use this method to connect to a Wi-Fi-enabled device, such as a computer or SMART Board interactive display, from anywhere in the classroom. There are three wireless connection methods: • Peer-to-Peer (P2P) (recommended) • Wi-Fi • Miracast

Read the sections below for the connection method you want to use.




Before completing these procedures, make sure you install the required software.

Using the USB method to connect

Use the included USB cable to connect the document camera to a computer.

To connect your document camera to a computer with a USB cable

1. Use the included USB cable to connect the USB B port on the document camera to a USB port on the computer:



TIP

If you need to extend the USB connection, see Troubleshooting and extending USB 2.0 and USB 3.0 connection.


- 2. Press on the control panel until the Wi-Fi indicator light is off.
- 3. Turn the document camera on and then press **Camera/PC** on the control panel or remote control.
- 4. Open the SMART Document camera software or SMART Notebook software, depending on which application you want to use to display the document camera's live images.

Using the HDMI method to connect

Use the HDMI Out port to connect the document camera to a display. Using this method only displays the document camera's live image on the connected display device. Use the remote control or control panel to change the picture (for example, zoom in, focus, freeze, and so on). If you want to record video or save captures of the live image, first attach a USB drive to the document camera.

To connect your document camera to a display device

1. Connect the HDMI cable to the **HDMI OUT** port on the document camera's rear connection panel.



- 2. Locate the **HDMI IN** port on the display device and connect the HDMI cable.
- Press the Camera/PC button on the control panel or remote control to switch the video signal to the display device.

Using the P2P method to connect

You can use the included Wi-Fi dongle to create a direct Peer-to-Peer (P2P) wireless connection between the document camera and your computer. This direct connection enables you to quickly connect the document camera without having to enter a password to connect school's network.

This is the easiest and recommended way to connect wirelessly.

NOTES

- If you connect using P2P, the document camera's built-in mic cannot be used to record sound. Instead, you must use the mic on the device you are connecting to for recording sound.
- SMART Notebook software cannot be used with this connection method. To use the document camera with SMART Notebook, use a USB connection.

To connect using P2P


1. Download and install the SMART Document Camera software.



For macOS, this download includes a driver for the Wi-Fi dongle that must be installed separately on the computer.

- 2. Connect the included Wi-Fi dongle to a USB port on your computer.
- 3. Open the SMART Document Camera software.

You will see your document camera listed.



TIP

Check the serial number on the bottom of the camera to find the camera name.

- 4. Click O.
- 5. Click Next.

Getting started





Using Camera mode to display objects and documents

When your document camera is connected to a projector, interactive display, or TV, you can display a full-screen image from your document camera. You can also access features and settings in the on-screen display (OSD) menu.



IMPORTANT

Your document camera must be connected to a display to use the OSD menu.

Using Camera mode

- 1. Connect your document camera to a projector or flat-panel display with an HDMI cable.
- 2. Press **Camera/PC** on the control panel or remote control.

The camera's image appears on the display.

Displaying printed documents

When you set your document camera to Camera mode, you can display documents.

TIP


Use the anti-glare sheet to reduce glare and optimize image quality. The anti-glare sheet is a special coated film that helps eliminate the glare you might encounter while displaying glossy objects, such as magazines and photos. Place the anti-glare sheet on top of an object to reduce reflected light.

To display documents

- 1. Place your documents on the table.
- 2. Adjust the document camera, and then aim its lens at your documents.

TIP

To change the orientation of the lens, twist the control on the camera head.



3. Press **Auto Focus** and on the control panel or remote control to adjust the focus.

Displaying objects

- 1. Press **Camera/PC** on the control panel or remote control.
- 2. Place the object, such as a document or a model, you want to display under the camera.
- 3. Rotate the camera head to aim the lens at your object.
- 4. If the image is too dark, press **Lamp** (on the control panel or remote control.

Rotating and mirroring the image

To rotate the image

Adjust the camera head to the desired shooting area, and press **Rotate** © on the remote control to rotate the image 180° or twist the control on the camera's head to rotate the image 90°.

To mirror the image

- 1. Press **Info** ⁽¹⁾ on the control panel or remote control to open the OSD menu.
- 2. Select Image.
- 3. Browse to and select MIRROR.
- 4. Select ON.
- 5. Press Info (1) again to exit the OSD menu.

Changing the picture mode or adding an effect

Using the remote control or OSD menu, you can change the image mode used to capture the object or document. You can also use the OSD menu to add an effect, such as switching the image to black and white or negative.

To change the picture mode

1. Press **Mode** on the remote control to switch between picture modes.

OR

Press Info (1) on the control panel or remote control to open the OSD menu, select Image > Preview Mode, and then select the mode you want.

Both methods provide the following options for image mode:

- Normal: This is the default mode. In most cases, Normal mode provides the best sharpness and color.
- **Motion**: Increases the frame rate to make movement in the live image smoother.
- High Quality: Provides the best image quality for your chosen shooting area and connected display.
- Microscope: For use when using the microscope adapter with the document camera.
- Macro: For use while capturing objects is 4" (10 cm) or less away from the document camera.
- **Infinity**: For use while capturing objects that are more than 30" (80 cm) away from the document camera.

To add an effect


- 1. Press Info on the control panel or remote control to open the OSD menu, navigate to Image > Effect, and then select the effect you want to add:
 - o Color
 - o B/W (Black and white)
 - Film negative
- 2. Press Info (1) again to exit the OSD menu.

Capturing images and videos to a USB drive

Use the USB port on the SMART Document Camera to save images and videos to a USB drive. To do this, set your document camera to Camera mode and connect a USB drive to the document camera.

TIP

You can also capture images and videos to your computer using SMART Notebook or SMART Document Camera 650 software.




Then, using the remote control or document camera's control panel, press the **Capture** button to save an image, or press the or **Record** button to start recording video. Press the **Record** button again to stop recording. When you are ready to view the files, connect the USB drive to a computer or interactive display.

Using a microscope with your document camera


Connect your document camera to a microscope to examine microscopic objects on a bigger screen.

Connecting your document camera to a microscope

1. Select the appropriate rubber coupler size for the microscope eyepiece and insert it in the microscope adapter.




2. Attach the microscope adapter to the document camera and tighten the three bolts until the adapter is secured.



IMPORTANT

Make sure the arrow on the camera head and microscope adapter are on the same side.

3. Attach the microscope adapter to the microscope's eyepiece and then connect the document camera to the microscope.



4. Turn the microscope adapter counterclockwise to line up the arrows and lock the microscope adapter in place.

To optimize microscope images

- 1. Press **Info** ⁽¹⁾ on the control panel or remote control to open the on-screen display (OSD) menu.
- 2. Select the **Image** tab.
- 4. Select **Microscope** and press **←**.
- 5. Adjust and aim the camera head at the furthest point, and then press the **AUTO FOCUS** button on the control panel or remote control.
- 6. Adjust the microscope's focus as needed.

Displaying a microscope slide

- 1. Place a slide or object on the stage of the microscope.
- 2. Focus the microscope so that the subject is sharp.

Using your document camera

3. Position the microscope under your document camera so the camera lens is aligned with the microscope eyepiece.



A CAUTION

Ensure you do not hit your document camera lens with the microscope. This could damage your document camera's lens.

- 4. Press the CAMERA/PC button on the control panel or remote control so that the document camera is in Camera mode.
- 5. Press Info (10) on the control panel or remote control to open the on-screen display (OSD) menu.
- 6. Select the Image tab.
- 7. Navigate to the **Preview Mode** sub-menu, and press **-**.
- 8. Select Microscope and press ←.

Using Miracast to view images on a display





Viewing saved images and videos in the library

Recordings or screen captures you take using the SMART Document Camera 650 software are saved to the Library, which is synchronized with your device's local drive. To view saved images and videos, open the *Library* tab. Then select either the *Image* or *Video* folder to see saved files.

To connect to the computer and turn on USB connection mode

- 1. Connect the document camera to the computer using the included USB cable.
- 2. Turn the document camera on and then press Camera/PC on the control panel or remote control.
- 3. On the computer, open SMART Notebook.







 - Capture to New Page: Use this to capture the current live image and insert it on a new SMART Notebook page.
 - Capture with Time-Lapse: Use this to capture a time-lapse of the document camera's live image. You can choose a duration for the time-lapse recording.

NOTE

If you press the **Capture** button on the document camera's control panel or remote control, it saves the live image to the SMART Notebook page and closes the *SMART Document Camera* viewer. Pressing the Capture button again re-opens the *SMART Document Camera* viewer.

- **3** Use these controls to zoom in or out on the live image.
- **4** Use these controls to increase or decrease the brightness of the live image.
- 5 Use these controls to adjust the focus. You can select Auto-Focus, Focus Out, and Focus In.
